Our time to disagree amongst Republicans was in the primary. Powdered drink mixes: Crystal light, Kool-aid, tea bags sealed in foil – not paper. (NO cocoa mixes at this time).

Salty foods: Mixed nuts, pretzels, crackers, BEEF jerky (pork is not permitted by Iraqi law).

If you do not have time to shop, please consider making a monetary donation so the area co-managers (Vicki Nixon and Cindy Phillips) can purchase supplies for you or apply the funds towards the mailing of these items.
