MINUTES



CY-FAIR REPUBLICAN WOMEN GENERAL MEETING June 12, 2007

President Kay Waghorne called the general meeting of the Cy-Fair Republican Women to order at 7:23 p.m. in her home. Alice McDill gave the invocation followed by the United States Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge of Allegiance. Kay welcomed members and introduced guests.

Jan Ott introduced the guest speaker, State Representative Bill Callegari (District 132). Rep. Callegari gave a most informative and interesting presentation on recent legislative proceedings within the Texas Legislature, including the following topics: issue involving House Speaker, Tom Craddick; the need for Republicans to vote in elections; important bills; issues regarding the budget, parks, border control, eminent domain, water and drainage. Rep. Callegari was presented with a Peter Barnes' children's book to sign which will be donated in his honor to a local school library.

The minutes of the May 8, 2007 general meeting were approved as printed in the recent newsletter.

Dawn Shull, Treasurer, reported a balance of \$4365.24 in the club's treasury. The report was accepted as presented.

Ways and Means Chair, Mary Moss, asked for more recipes to be submitted for the club's cookbook. She hopes everyone would send in at least one recipe per section. Forms are available in the newsletter as well as on the website. Volunteers are also needed to type the recipes. If you can assist, please contact Mary. Kay Waghorne announced that members were invited to attend the ceremony introducing the postage stamp honoring Margaret Chase Smith at the GOP Houston headquarters on Wednesday, June 13, at 10 a.m. On June 19 there will be a Cy-Fair Chamber of Commerce dinner featuring State Representative Corbin Van Arsdale. Call Kay for more information. Kay circulated a sign-up sheet for those interested in filling the vacant positions of Registration Chair, Chaplain and Community Activities Chair.

Rita Parrish, Newsletter Editor, reminded members to submit articles for the newsletter two weeks prior to the next general meeting.

STANDING RULES COMMITTEE REPORT



The standing rules committee has drafted a list of standing rules that we are proposing for our club to adopt. We have used some guidelines from other clubs and considered our experience with the club to date. The committee thinks that we have drafted a good set of rules to help our club continue to be successful. Please review the list below so that we may discuss and vote on them at the July meeting.

Cy-Fair Republican Women Proposed Standing Rules

- Each year the newly elected president shall call a joint meeting of the out-going and incoming Executive Board prior to the January meeting in order to preserve continuity and transition.
- For the installation of officers, the President-elect may choose the installation official. The official TFRW president's pin is presented to the new President by the outgoing President at the installation. The Treasurer is responsible for ordering the pin from TFRW and paying for it with club funds. The outgoing 1st Vice-President shall be responsible for a gift for the outgoing President.
- 3 The outgoing Program Chairman is responsible for the January program.
- 4 The outgoing Newsletter Editor is responsible for the January newsletter.
- 5 The outgoing Treasurer will file the January PAC report before transferring duties to the new Treasurer.
- 6 Cy-Fair Republican Women's archives shall be kept in a detailed notebook by each officer and standing committee chairman to be passed on to their successor. Each notebook will contain the position's job description and all records pertaining to their activities.
- 7 All CFRW newsletters, which include the minutes, shall be kept by the 3rd Vice-President.

- 8 The club scrapbook will be given to each president for her term. She will make it available for future club use.
- 9 A list of CFRW property and storage of banner shall be the duty of the President.
- 10 Guest speakers (other than candidates) are presented with a suitable gift from the CFRW by the 1st Vice President.
- New members shall be listed in the newsletter along with their addresses and phone numbers. This information is given to the third vice-president by the membership chairman.
- 12 The American and Texas flags are kept and brought to each meeting and appropriately displayed by the hospitality chairman.
- 13 The General membership shall approve all major expenditures over \$300.
- 14 The 2nd Vice-president shall submit a budget for any major fundraising event for approval by the Executive Board.
- 15 Memorials in the amount of \$25.00 shall be given to the TFRW Scholarship Fund in the event of the death of a primary member.
- No candidate, or a relative of a candidate, shall be a member of the Campaign Fund Disbursement Committee.
- 17 Each member shall be given a club directory. If a member needs a replacement, it may be purchased for \$15.00.
- 18 The CFRW Directory shall be distributed only to CFRW members for their personal use. A list of names and mailing addresses only may be sold to Republican candidates with the consent of the Executive Board.
- Announcements in the CFRW newsletter and at general meetings need approval by the President and/or the Executive Board.
- 20 Any printed material released in the name of CFRW shall be issued only with the prior approval of the President and/or Executive Committee.
- 21 All written materials, except campaign materials, distributed at CFRW functions shall be reviewed and approved by the President and/or Executive Board.
- 22 Club email procedures will be followed:
 - 1. Emails to the membership are limited to CFRW or Republican information and are subject to the approval of the President and/or Board.
 - 2. The CFRW's electronic e-mail roster will not be furnished to anyone outside of the club by the board or any individual members.
 - 3. All emails sent to the general membership shall be listed in BCC:(blind carbon copy) so that the email addresses are not visible.
- In non-partisan elections, candidates may be invited to speak at meetings with approval from the Executive Board. The club is not obligated to invite every candidate for a position in these races. However, if two or more known Republicans are seeking the same office, when one is invited to speak all shall be given this courtesy.
- 24 CFRW shall subscribe to the TFRW President's monthly newsletter for the Executive Board's use as determined by the Board.
- 25 It is customary for both year's President be the club's honoree at the bi-annual TFRW Tribute to Women. More than one honoree may be chosen.
