



## A Minute with Mary



I am by no means an economic expert. I know that there is no cut and dried answer to solve the problems that our economy faces today. Again, I am no expert, but my feeling related to "The Stimulus Package" that has just been signed into law does not help the people that are most in need of help. From what I've read and heard on the TV news shows, a very small portion of the \$787 BILLION will be put in the pockets of the people to help stimulate anything. According to the Sunday February 15, 2009 Houston Chronicle, only \$73.8 billion is slated for tax credits and \$82.3 billion goes to extend unemployment benefits and health insurance help for the unemployed. That's roughly 20% of the total package that will go to those citizens most in need. The other 80% is in the hands of the government bureaucracy. More big government is not the answer.


