LEGISLATIVE

The <u>Texas Tribute</u> published an article revealing that Texas lawmakers want

defense technology on the border. Lawmakers gathered in Washington to discuss how to use military technology for border security as the United States draws down its participation in the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts.

Texas legislators demonstrated particular interest in acquiring defense equipment to protect our border with Mexico. Advocates for military technology on the border feel it is an attractive option because it could save tax money and complement U.S. Border Patrol human resources.

U.S. Rep. Henry Cuella D- Larendo questioned what will happen to the equipment in Iraq and Afghanistan after the U.S. withdraws an a (for which) we paid billions of dollars. Cuellar went on to query what overseas equipment will become available and how to actually transport it to the Texas – Mexico border

Officials from the U.S. Department of Defense and Homeland Security testified that defense equipment

worth almost \$500 million had already gone to federal, state, and local agencies in fiscal in fiscal year 2011 for counter- terrorism and counter- drug activities.

More defense technology on the border could help Border Patrol agents "though more boots on the ground are still needed," commented Rep. Michael Mc Caul, an Austin Republican.

Texas representative's interest in putting more military equipment on the border is not new. Cries to "ramp up" the acquisition process have frequently been heard as the crisis in Mexico continues to escalate and threaten America's safety and security.

Some law makers concur that returning service members from Iraq and Afghanistan will have valuable expertise in some of the defense technology that could find its way to Texas, and that this well spring of knowledge and experience could be utilized to enhance security efforts on our borders.
