The 2011 Texas redistricting cycle promises to be a high-stake, contentious exercise. According to the 2010 Census, Texas stands to gain four Congressional seats in the U.S. House of Representatives, more than any other state. Texas's state Senate and House of Representatives lines will be redrawn as well.

Predictably, battles over state redistricting began the day after the November 2nd general election. Early tensions resulted when Texas House General Investigating and Ethics Committee responded to redistricting allegations of irregularities. The investigation is on going. Two lawsuits concerning redistricting have surfaced. Both deal with the 2010 Census Hispanic figures. Attorney Michael Hull's suit contends that counting undocumented immigrants political districts has an unfair and illegal effect on voters in districts

with smaller numbers of noncitizens. In the second lawsuit, the Mexican Legislative Caucus filed against the state of Texas alleging that poor illegal immigrants were undercounted because the U.S. Census Bureau failed to mail forms 800 between and 1200 individuals. Judge Ramon Garcia, Hidalgo County, claims that flawed Census practices cost the county \$300 million to \$400 million in federal funding.

Redistricting procedures are spelled out in the Texas State Constitution. On January 28, 2011, Lt. General David Dewhurst announced the make-up of the Senate Redistricting Committee. It will be comprised of eight Republicans and six Democrats. The House Committee will be composed of twelve Republicans and five Democrats.

The Census data reports that the average number of citizens per representative should be 701,901 to ensure equal representation in accordance with the "one-person one-vote" principle, According to


the American Community Survey, data based on 2009 results shows only six of Texas's 32 districts have lost population, districts 11, 13, 19, 20,29, and 30. Latinos were responsible for the largest percentage of Texas's population growth and received one new district. Sixteen incumbents could be competing in 2012 after their districts are paired under the new redistricting map. Rural areas such as East Texas and the Western Panhandle lost representation to urban areas such as San Antonio and Dallas

Many areas of contention still persist. To date, eleven bills concerning redistricting have been referred to legislative committees. As of March 18, 2011, the Senate Redistricting Committee had held two hearings. More are scheduled. When the smoke clears, how the state legislative boundaries are drawn will significantly influence Texas politics for the coming decade.

Thanks to everyone who donates to Caring for America. We still need items to ship to our troops. Items we need are: lunch size packages of crackers, cookies or chips; gum, candy (nothing twist wrapped), powdered drink mixes, granola

bars, packs of instant oatmeal, small individual cereals, condiments packets from fast food restaurants, lunch size packages of tuna, or beef jerky (pork is not permitted). Other items: safety sealed lip balm, dental floss, toothbrushes, and toothpaste; travel size tubes of sunblock, lotion, foot powder, and petroleum jelly; travel or motel size shampoo and conditioner; small safety sealed Advil/Tylenol or any other OTC medications; small safety sealed contact lens solution, eye drops; AA and AAA batteries, disposable cameras, sunglasses; DVD's, music CD's, blank CD's, tape cassettes; articles torn out of magazines, crossword puzzles, word searches;

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRINTING THE UPDATED MEMBERSHIP BOOK PAGES

The updates for the CFRW membership book are now on the web site. If you are a new member and just received your membership book, the updates are in your book. For everyone else, you can get the updates off the CFRW web site. Here's how:

Go to "Members Only" (You will need the password – call me if you don't know it); Go to "Membership Book" – there is a section for each section in the Membership Book Select the section you want to print.

Go to File/Print.

To print on both sides of the paper (front and back):

On the print box – **PRINT RANGE** Choose "Pages from – All pages" Subset – choose odd pages

On the box – PAGE HANDLING

Paper Scaling: choose "Multiple pages per sheet"

Pages per sheet: choose "2"

Page Order: Choose "Horizontal" **PRINT**

Turn paper over, load back into printer

Change Subset to even pages

PRINT again.

Cut the pages down the middle, punch holes and insert in your book.

To print on one side only:

Leave the Subset on "All Pages in Range"

Everything else is the same.

Be sure to reset printer settings back to your default. If you have any questions, give me a call. Mary Moss – 281-550-9415
