## Early voting begins October 24

## Proposition 1

The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a $100 \%$ or totally disabled veteran.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the legislature to provide the surviving spouse of a $100 \%$ or totally disabled veteran with an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the surviving spouse's residence homestead as long as the surviving spouse has not remarried, the property was the residence homestead of the surviving spouse when the qualifying veteran died, and the property remains the residence homestead of the surviving spouse.

## Proposition 2

The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of additional general obligation bonds by the Texas Water Development Board in an amount not to exceed $\$ 6$ billion at any
time outstanding.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the Texas Water Development Board to issue additional general obligation bonds on a continuing basis for one or more accounts of the Texas Water Development Fund II, with the restriction that the total amount of
bonds outstanding at any time does not exceed $\$ 6$ billion.

## Proposition 3

The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds of the state to finance educational loans to students.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board or its successors to issue and sell general obligation bonds on a continuing basis for the purpose of financing educational loans for students.

## Proposition 4

The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to permit a county to issue bonds or notes to finance the development or redevelopment of an unproductive, underdeveloped, or blighted area and to pledge for repayment of the bonds or notes increases in ad valorem taxes imposed by the county on property in the area. The amendment does not provide authority for increasing ad valorem tax rates.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the legislature to permita county to issue bonds or notes to finance the development or redevelopment of an unproductive, underdeveloped, or blighted area within the county, and to pledge increases in ad valorem tax revenues imposed on property in the area by the county for repayment of such bonds or notes. The amendment does not provide independent authority for increasing ad valorem tax rates.

## Proposition 5

The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to allow cities or counties to enter into interlocal contracts with other cities
or counties without the imposition of a tax or the provision of a sinking fund.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the legislature to allow cities and counties to enter into interlocal contracts with other cities and counties without having to assess an ad valorem tax and set aside a specified amount of funds for the payment of costs under the interlocal contract.

## Proposition 6

The constitutional amendment clarifying references to the permanent school fund, allowing the General Land Office to distribute revenue from permanent school fund land or other properties to the available school fund to provide additional funding for public education, and providing for an increase in the market value of the permanent school fund for the purpose
of allowing increased distributions from the available school fund.
Summary: This proposition increases the amount of principal that is available for withdrawal from the permanent school fund each year and would also clarify certain references to that fund
in the constitution. Increased access to the principal of the state public education trust fund is based upon granting the authority to consider alternative market calculations when determining the amount of principal that is available for distribution to the available school fund. The Proposition also provides authority to distribute to the available school fund annual revenue from school fund land or other properties up to $\$ 300$ million per year.

## Proposition 7

The constitutional amendinent authorizing the legislature to permi
 reclamation districts in El Paso County to issue bonds supported by ad valorem taxes to fund the development and maintenance of parks and recreational facilities.
Summary: This proposition adds El Paso County to the list of counties authorized to create conservation and reclamation districts to develop parks and recreational facilities financed by taxes.

## Proposition 8

The constitutional amendment providing for the appraisal for ad valorem tax purposes of open space land devoted to water-stewardship
purposes on the basis of its productive capacity.
Summary: This proposition requires the legislature to provide for taxation of open space land dedicated to the purposes of water stewardship on the basis of its productive capacity.

## Proposition 9

The constitutional amendment authorizing the governor to grant a pardon to a person who successfully completes a term of deferred adjudication community supervision.
Summary: This proposition authorizes the governor, on the written recommendation and advice of the Board of Pardons and Paroles, to grant a pardon, reprieve, or commutation of punishment to a
person who successfully completes a term of deferred adjudication community supervision.

## Proposition 10

The constitutional amendment to change the length of the unexpired term that causes the automatic resignation of certain elected county or district officeholders if they become candidates for another office.
Summary: This proposition extends the length of the unexpired term that causes the automatic resignation of certain local elected officeholders if they announce candidacy or become candidates for another office from one year to
one year and 30 days.
