#### **LEGISLATIVE - Dawn Shull**



So now the federal government is going to MANDATE that individuals and businesses buy a commodity or be fined, maybe even jailed. Does anyone else hear the sound of a knife ripping through the US Constitution?

Does it not turn your stomach to hear politicos arguing gleefully over which American taxpayer pocket to pick to pay for the monstrosity the Senate just moved forward and dares to call a Health Care Reform Bill?? Hmm, should it be taxpayers who elect plastic surgery or go tanning or just those who have worked hard enough be in a comfortable position financially? While Rome burns, Congress fiddles. What madness to be proposing huge new entitlements and taxes when our economy is faltering with no relief in sight, but not for the current regime in power. Never has it been so clear that elections have consequences. To those who sat out last November's election to show disgruntlement with the Republican party — are you happy with this outcome?

Why the hurry? It seems the Democrat leadership can't wait to give Obama his Rose Garden signing moment. However, haste does make waste: "Writing of the latest scheme to secure a compromise, the editors of *The Washington Post* noted<sup>1</sup>, 'The only thing more unsettling than watching legislative sausage being made is watching it being made on the fly'."<sup>2</sup>

For a clear thinking summary of the Copenhagen climate conference you must read George Will's article<sup>5</sup> in which he states: Actually, the mountain beneath the summit — a mountain of manufactured hysteria, predictable cupidity, antic demagoguery and dubious science — labored mightily and gave birth to a mouselet, a 12-paragraph document committing the signatories to ... make a list. <sup>5</sup>
