Summer is here and in full force! What an awesome time we had at the Republican State Convention. I believe our members logged in well over 100 hours during the event. It was a learning experience for all of us, plus just a great time to be with friends with "like conservative minds."

A Special thank-you goes out to Rep. Allen Fletcher, who stepped in at the last moment to switch places with Rep. Bill Callegari, who was originally slated to be our Guest Speaker for June. We really appreciate his insightful presentation and look forward to his next visit.

We will welcome **Texas Senator Dan Patrick**, District 7, SH 249, as

our guest speaker for July.

He received a B.A. in English from the University of Maryland,



Baltimore. After many years of Broadcasting, he entered politics as a member of the Texas Senate in 2007. As a conservative member of the Texas Senate, Dan proves that one person can make a difference in Austin if they keep their promises and stick to their principles. In his first session, Senator Patrick passed a bill placing "In God We Trust" permanently in the Senate Chamber and was the Senate author to place "Under God" in our state pledge.

This past session, Dan passed nearly 40 bills, including 18 of his

top 20 priority issues. One of his top accomplishments was authoring the biggest tax cut passed in any state this year, a \$172 million tax cut affecting 40,000 small businesses. Three of his other maior accomplishments happened in the district when Dan helped lead a coalition to finalize a deal for the new University Center on 249 making college more affordable and accessible to thousands in his district. Dan also passed a bill requiring back up power for water districts so we do not repeat the loss of water experienced during Hurricane Ike. Dan also passed an important crime fighting bill to give counties more power to regulate and shut down sexually oriented businesses

For the second time in two sessions, Dan passed a bill requiring a doctor, before performing an abortion, to perform an ultrasound and offer the woman the option to view it. Although it died in the House again, he will keep fighting for this bill.

Senator Patrick is currently Vice Chair of the Education and Higher Education committees. He also serves on the Health and Human Services, Criminal Justice, and two other committees. He is known for his hard work ethic, being prepared on the issues, and being one of the best debaters on the Senate floor.

After the recent session, Senator Patrick worked to save the optional 20% homestead exemption in Cy Fair ISD, saving the average homeowner nearly \$700 a year. He has been recognized as "Legislator of the Year" by a wide variety of groups, such as the Independent Electrical Contractors and District Attorneys Association of Texas. Dan was awarded for his work on healthcare by the Harris County Medical Society and given the top award by Texans for Lawsuit Reform for his continued staunch support for tour reform in Texas.

Dan recently produced an award winning Christian film *The Heart* of *Texas*, voted best film made in Texas for 2009, and is author of the book <u>The Second Most Important</u> <u>Book You Will Ever Read</u>, a challenge to read the Bible. He owns and operates talk radio stations in Dallas and Houston and does a daily talk show each afternoon when time permits. He has been married for 34 years to

Jan. Their son Ryan is an assistant D.A. in Harris County and their daughter Shane is attending nursing school.

Texas Legislature: Primary gives first look at conservative '13

The <u>San Angelo Standard Times</u> published an article (May 29, 2012 ed.) by Jim Vertuno (AP) which suggested that the first hints of just how conservative the 2013 Texas Legislature will be began to emerge in Tuesday's primary election. Early returns showed conservatives, still fueled by a strong tea party movement, pushing to keep a strong grip on Texas public policy.

Republicans hold large majorities in both the House and Senate and are all but guaranteed to stay in power in 2013, but redistricting, retirement and ambition for new office led to some blistering campaigns, particularly among some GOP colleagues.

Even in a Legislature that rolled over Democrats to cut \$4 billion in education, pass a voter ID law and place more restrictions on women seeking an abortion in 2011, this year's primary campaigns were dominated by Republicans trying to prove who among them is the most conservative.

The Tea Party movement that pushed House Republicans to a 101-49 supermajority in that chamber was again engaged in several key races across the state. In the House, Gov. Rick Perry wader into several campaigns to support Tea Party candidates and early returns showed the failed presidential candidate still holds strong influence within. Perry endorsed Rep. James White who's been in office since 2003.

Perry also backed state Rep. Kelly Hancock over state Rep. Todd Smith and for Senate District 9 in Dallas and Tarrant Counties and Hancock rolled to an easy victory.

"I'm proud to have supported strong fiscal and social conservatives across Texas who will join me in working to support stricter limits on government spending, opposing tax increases and preserving a strong rainy day fund," Perry said.

Republican House Speaker Joe Straus defeated challenger Matt Beebe, but he also learned that his leadership will be challenged again when the Legislature convenes in January 2013. Rep. Bryan Hughes of Marshall announced Tuesday he'll run for House speaker, an office elected by the House members. Some GOP House members claim that Straus isn't conservative enough. "Tonight we have shown you can campaign on the power of positive ideas and not be drawn into the politics of personal destruction," Straus said. "As Speaker of the House, I will continue to provide respectful leadership that allows all voices to be heard."

OLD BUSINESS:


