Regular Primary Voting Day is Tuesday, May 29, 2012 and you can find your regular voting location by going to this link http://www.harrisvotes.com/Voter-BallotSearch.aspx.

Some people think 'Well it's just the primary and it doesn't mean much'. This is the wrong way to look at the voting process. Even though the Presidential candidate might seem clear at this point there are many other races that need your help. F.M. 1960 Meeting - TxDOT is holding two meetings to gather public input on the proposed construction of raised medians along SH 6/FM 1960 from IH 10 to SH 249. The project improvements are proposed to meet current safety standards. No additional right of way would be required for the proposed project, and no displacements would be necessary. Exhibits showing the proposed project will be displayed at the meeting. Representatives from TxDOT will be available to answer questions. Written comments relating to the proposed project may be presented at the meeting or submitted to the Director of Project Development, Texas Department of Transportation, P.O. Box 1386, Houston, Texas 77251-1386. Comments may also be emailed to HOU-PIOWebMail@txdot.gov. Comments must be received by June 14. The meetings will be held

Please Note: These upcoming meetings are similar to the meetings conducted by TxDOT on raised medians for FM 1960 from SH 249 to IH 45. TxDOT conducted community meetings to gather input in 2006, and the median project began in 2010. Please participate in these upcoming meetings if you have concerns about raised medians along FM 1960 from IH 10 to SH 249.

<u>Champions Drive Not to Be Extended</u> - A rumor is circulating that Champions Drive is going to be extended through to Cypresswood Drive. Commissioner Cagle's office confirmed that the rumor is false. There are currently no plans to extend Champions Drive. The rumor likely began because of a mound of unpermitted dirt in the vicinity, which appeared to be construction materials.

May is Stroke Awareness Month - About 795,000 Americans each year suffer a new or recurrent stroke. That means, on average, a stroke occurs every 40 seconds. The high occurrence of stroke places it as the No. 4 cause of death and a leading cause of disability in the United States.
