Joy's Journal

Nuts and bolts are two pieces of metal that can be used in unison to hold something together. Like the nut and bolt, our job as Republican Women is to hold our party together and securely fasten our conservative principles to the leadership of our club and country. Nuts and bolts come in a range of sizes and shapes and must be chosen carefully for the specific job they are to perform. Within our clubs the members also have a wide range of interests and talents that need to be utilized in order to be an effective club.

Toni Anne Dashielle and Rachel Woods, co-authors of Leading for Freedom: Leadership Skills for Republican Women, were the keynote speakers at the Nuts and Bolts Workshop sponsored by the Greater Houston Council. Toni Anne emphasized the importance of delegating within clubs responsibilities and committees. She outlined five main points to be considered when delegating. The first step is to select a capable and committed person. Secondly, the delegate should clearly understand the task and the objectives to be accomplished. Next the delegate should be provided with the necessary resources for accomplishing the task. Fourth we need to ensure that the delegate agrees to assume the responsibility and finally, we need to build in accountability for performing the task. According to Toni Anne, the results of delegating would be higher morale and higher productivity among the club

members.(Get ready, we will be calling on you!)

Communication was the word of the day from Rachel Woods. She gave a number of pointers on how to listen authentically and actively. Let people vent frustrations as they are more likely to hear you if you listen to hem first. Making eye contact, listening for details, and asking questions are important n this step. Acknowledge what has been said. You do not have to agree to acknowledge but you should not sound as if you're judging them. Summarize what the person has said in a kind tone of voice. We want to work toward goals common through effective communication. Rachel's words will help us in communicating among ourselves as well as with others in our sphere of influence.

Also on the program were short sessions on Parliamentary Procedure, and Tips for Treasurers and Fundraisers. Rounding out the program was a short presentation by Carolyn Hodges, our TFRW President. Carolyn explained how our dues were distributed between NFRW, TFRW and the local club. NFRW receives \$10.00 of your membership fee, TFRW receives \$5.00 and the remaining \$15.00 stays with our local club. During the 2012 election cycle, TFRW members contributed over 800,000 hours of service and over \$500,000 to local and state candidates. Carolyn's theme for her term has been "Focus on the Outcome, Imagine our Impact". I think these accomplishments prove she is right.

I would like to thank the 8 members and officers who attended this workshop with me: Millie Alford, Barbara Buxton, Cindy Deister, Mary Moss, Jaime Pierce, Nancy Roberts, Melissa Ronquillo and Linda Truhlar. CFRW will definitely benefit from all we learned and like the nuts and bolts our increased knowledge and skills will strengthen our club.
