Dear Friends,

The Speaker has appointed committees and hearings have begun. I am pleased to have been selected to serve again on the State Affairs Committee, and honored to have been named Chair of the Environmental Regulation Committee.

Speaker Straus appointed 26 Republican Chairs and 14 Democratic Chairs. The Speaker had the extraordinary responsibility of assessing the talent and ability of nearly 40 new members coupled with the seniority and overall diversity of the House membership.

Environmental Regulation is a whole new subject area for me and one that I am eager to undertake. The committee's jurisdiction includes all matters pertaining to air, land and water pollution (including the environmental regulation of industrial development), and regulation of waste disposal. The committee also has oversight over agencies that regulate environmental matters, including the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, The Department of State Health Services and the Texas Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Compact Commission. Serving as Chair of this committee will allow for an inside look at the challenges we face and the solutions available, so that we can continue to protect and preserve the quality of life for the residents of our state. I look forward to working with the members of the committee to address these issues.

State Affairs is one of the largest committees in the House and has jurisdiction over utility regulation, regulation of the residential construction industry, regulation of pipelines and pipeline companies, and the regulation and operation of state agencies, state buildings, public lands and matters of state policy. State Affairs will also have jurisdiction over immigration issues.

In our last newsletter we posed our first "response requested" question. The question dealt with whether or not to allow liquor stores to be open on Sunday. With 96 responses, we found that 69% were for the proposal and 31% against it. 2ND RESPONSE REQUESTED QUESTION: How do you feel about a Constitutional Amendment that would allow voters to decide on whether or not to legalize gambling in Texas?

## Funding Texas' Roads – Is increasing the gas tax the answer?

There are lots of challenges facing our legislators in Austin this session. One of the items that will be discussed and which may have possible legislative action affecting the budget, as does almost everything, is whether to increase the gas tax.

I think everyone knows that we have financial challenges with our transportation system. At this time, analysts doubt that there will be any change in the gas tax as it is politically unpopular, but, some lawmakers feel it is too important to ignore. The 20 cent gas tax has not changed since 1991 and since it is not tied to inflation or when you consider the increased fuel efficiency of vehicles it has been a declining source of revenue. Another thing to consider when looking at the gas tax is that not all of the money from this source goes to transportation.

Some Republican lawmakers argue that increasing the gas tax is a more conservative approach than to go billions of dollars into debt. Transportation debt accounts for 57.6 percent of the debt that will be issued in 2013. The \$10 billion dollar per year Texas Department of Transportation agency has said that they need an additional \$1 billion annually for maintenance and another \$3 billion to grow the state's road system. Without more funding, reliance on debt and toll roads is the only alternative. Both of these methods are the most expensive way to maintain our road system.

The needed funds could also come from other sources of existing revenue. Currently, part of the gas tax goes to the TX Dept. of Public Safety. If that were changed and the state troopers were funded from the general revenue fund that would free up more dollars for roads. Another 25 percent of the revenue goes to public education and cannot be changed without voter approval. Other ideas would allocate sales tax from the sale of new and used vehicles to transportation or sales tax on auto repairs could be dedicated to roads. Vehicle sales taxes represent \$3 billion/year in funds that goes to the general revenue fund.

Other ways to increase the revenue stream from new sources besides the possible increase in gas taxes would be to increase vehicle registration fees by \$50 which would also impact consumers and alone would not be Whatever way we go, we want to encourage our lawmakers to make smart choices on how our dollars are spent. Funding sources must be predictable, transportation related, and automatically adjustable for inflation. We know our roads are a necessary part of our infrastructure and part of government's core responsibility and they must be funded to meet the mobility needs of our rapidly growing state.
