Step 4. Put together talking points to counter the Democrat's talking points. This is also already being done by the RPT and the RNC and will also be out

Step 5. Pick one day a month for everyone to block walk to register voters; for safety go in pairs. Try to engage people in a conversation to use your talking points. Make it personal. Try to talk to the woman of the house. Focus on women's issues identified in step 3; i.e. the economy is a woman's issue, the faulty "War on Women". Remember, we need to have a unified and positive message.

Step 6. Be prepared; have a box that has everything you will need, but don't make it heavy if you are block walking. If you have some kind of badge holder, wear your certification This is your identification. Remember, Texas law says you MUST register anyone who wants to be registered. You CANNOT only register Republicans, BUT we are usually more polite than Democrats and we have a positive message. This will stay with people.

Step 7. After a few days, follow up

with a hand written note to those you registered. Again, make it personal. Step 8. After a couple of weeks, follow up to be sure they got their voter card. If not, check on it.

Let me know how many people were registered and in how many different counties your members are deputized. Give me feedback, both good and bad. We may tweek the program a little and go longer.


PROGRAMS ~ Barbara Buxton

Texas Representative Dwayne Bohac

Elected in November 2002 and serving his 6th term, Representative Bohac is a life-long resident of House District 138. He represents the areas of Spring Branch, Bear Creek, Cy-Fair and Katy. In the 83rd Session he is serving as a member of the prestigious Ways and Means Committee, as Vice Chairman of the Business and Industry Committee,

and is a member of the Local and Consent Calendar Committee which sets local bills on the calendar. During the legislative session he focused on fundamentally transforming and bringing innovation to the public school system and allowing parents public school choice. He also authored the "Merry Christmas Bill" which will clear up the usage of the words Christmas and Hanukkah so that they can be used freely in the classroom.

Bohac has been recognized on a number of occasions for his hard work in the Texas Legislature. He was awarded "Taxpayers Best Friend" and the "Education Advocate Award" by members of the Texas House and was recently referred to as a "crusading tax fighter" for his consistent work on appraisal reform and property tax reduction. Further, he was recognized by the police chiefs of the six largest cities in Texas for his determination to pass common sense criminal justice legislation which supports local law enforcement.



Bohac is also a co-founder of the Texas House of Representative's "Air Quality Caucus," a bi-partisan group committed to finding clean air solutions for our community and state. Recently, Bohac received the "Wind Champion Award" for helping Texas become the number one state in wind generated electricity.

LEGISLATIVE: Transportation Bill Finally Passes -Now, It Is Up To The Voters

The third and final Special Legislative session is over. Our Texas lawmakers were relieved to finally adjourn on August 5 as this "part-time" job turned into an extended 83rd Legislative Session lasting more than seven months. After failing to get a transportation bill passed in the second Special Session, Governor Perry called for the third session with only transportation funding in the call. During this third session, a bill finally got passed. The regular session was notable for bipartisan coalitions and harmony, while the special sessions were at times filled with partisan battles and roadblocks.

Transportation funding in Texas is in everyone's interest as we must meet our growing needs. TxDOT has said it needs \$4 billion in additional annual funding to maintain current congestion levels as the population grows. I hesitate to use the word "investment" as it is often just used to put a better spin on spending, but, the need for roads and water are true investment necessities and commitment to transportation is a significant step in advancing mobility projects into the future.

The bill that passed, SJR 1, will be on the ballot in November of 2014 and would divert some of the revenue from oil and gas production which currently goes to the Rainy Day Fund to the Highway Fund. It would mean an estimated \$1.2 billion dollar annual increase for the Texas Department of Transportation, roughly a quarter of what the projected need is. If it is not approved by the voters, the 2015 legislative session is likely to blow the lid off of the capitol!

A roadblock in passing a bill that uses part of the Rainy Day Fund has been how to create some sort of minimum balance. The version that passed will require a select joint committee of legislators to recommend a minimum balance before each regular legislative session. Then members of both chambers will be given a chance to vote in favor of

that minimum or a different balance. If a majority of both chambers can't agree on one by the 45th day of the session, then the committee's recommendation will be enacted. Another provision that was added in order to pass the bill requires a greater buy-in on the part of TxDot. It would require them to find \$100 million in "efficiencies" over the 2014-15 biennium and put that money toward paying the agency's multibillion-dollar debt. This would save the agency \$47 million in debt service payments. "This plan enables us to relieve congestion on Texas roadways ,while protecting our state's 'AAA' bond rating with a healthy balance in the Rainy Day Fund," said Lt. Gov. <u>David Dewhurst</u>. "

The oil and gas production tax revenue that is earmarked for the Rainy Day Fund has grown more than expected. The state's oil and gas production taxes are likely to come in \$900 million higher than previously projected for the fiscal year that ends Sept. 31. Three-quarters of that, \$675 million, will be deposited in the Rainy Day Fund.

While not a part of the transportation funding legislative debate, part of the transportation funding problems have resulted in TxDOT's announcement that in an effort to stretch their dollars they will be converting some damaged asphalt roads to gravel and they will also begin considering whether to end their commitment to maintaining some well-traveled urban roads in cities of over 50,000 people. For example, TxDot says that Westheimer Road in Houston should no longer qualify as a state responsibility. At one time, it was part of the farm-to-market road system. This plan could shift \$165 million of state cost onto cities.

This bill, if enacted will help with our important transportation needs. The next move is now up to you!
