Let's begin this year by learning all we can about participating in making the Republican Party a viable organization that truly represents each and every American citizen. How can we as individuals help in forming the state and national platform?

One very important way is to participate in the primary election that is scheduled to take place on March 4, 2014. This sounds simple, however, this involves more than just showing up at the polls and casting a ballot. How many of you have participated in a Precinct Convention? A Precinct Convention is generally held on Election Day at your polling site. The Convention is held shortly after the polls close and voting is finished. The time and the place of the Convention are posted at the entrance of each polling place.

The rules that govern the Convention allow for the Precinct Chair to serve as the Temporary Convention Chair. The purpose of the Convention is the election of a Permanent Chair and

Secretary, the adoption of resolutions to be forwarded to the Senate District Convention, and the election of delegates and alternates to the Senate District Convention. The number of delegates and alternates is set by state party rules and is based on a ratio of one delegate and one alternate delegate to a designated number of votes cast in the precinct in the preceding gubernatorial election.

It's important that we as Republican Women return to our precincts for these Conventions. The grassroots begin here. This is our opportunity to send the delegates and alternates we pick to the Senate District Convention and to put forth resolutions we would like to see in the State and National Platform. We do have a voice but we have to be

willing to make sure we are heard. By not attending these Conventions, we are letting others make the choice for us.

Delegates and Alternates will then attend the Senate District Convention that will be held on a designated Saturday in their area. The purpose of the SDC is to elect permanent officers, adopt Convention rules, pass resolutions and forward them to the State Convention, and elect delegates and alternates to the State Convention. At the Convention each precinct will be assigned a seating area and will be responsible for electing a designated number of delegates and alternates to represent them at the State Convention. Some members will also be appointed as at-large delegates to attend the State Convention in June.

The next step in the Convention Process is the State Convention and ultimately the National Convention in presidential election years. At each level delegates to the next level are chosen, but it all begins at the Precinct Conventions. If you truly want to be more involved and have more input into the running of our great country, you will attend and participate in every step of the coming elections. I hope to see a large number of our ladies attending the State Convention. Remember you have to attend the Precinct and Senate District Conventions to get to the State Convention. ALL THE WAY TO STATE ladies of CFRW!




CFRW*FEBRUARY 11TH GENERAL MEETING


