



He analyzes a wealth of data to show how changes in the state's demographics--including an influx of new residents, the shift from rural to urban, and the growth of the Mexican American population--have moved Texas through three stages of party competition, from two-tiered politics, to two-party competition between Democrats and Republicans, and then to the return to one-party dominance, this time by Republicans.

Passing the Budget - HB 1 in the House and Senate

2015 is fully underway and all of the newly elected officials have finished their swearing-in ceremonies and the legislative session has begun. Committees in both the House and Senate will be named and bills will start to make their way through the legislative process.

In our newsletter last month, House Bill 1 was briefly discussed. With space limited we only had room to introduce the fact that HB 1 was passed and would be put into effect in the upcoming year. Here is a little more info on what will happen with this bill.

The state budget is otherwise known as the Appropriations Bill and it is a very important one. This bill alternates between the House and Senate each year. The budget will start in the House this year as HB 1. This is a very complex process because there are so many parts to the Appropriations Act. It is composed of 12 Articles, or sections, which include every state agency having a specific article. There are committees and subcommittees made up of members of the Appropriations Committee and they are assigned to hear testimony and review the budget requests from the various state agencies. These articles include General Government, Health and Human Services, Education, Business and Economic Development, Judiciary, Natural Resources and Public Safety and Criminal Justice among others. As we can see this is a long process which requires much debate and review to determine that each agency is utilizing their funds in the most efficient and effective manner. The subcommittees hold hearings with the various agencies and report information back to the Appropriations committee and the individual budgets are incorporated into the full bill, HB 1.

The next step is getting the bill passed by the Appropriations Committee. After going through many amendments (typically 250+ are submitted) which are debated on the House floor, the final product is then voted on by the House and sent to the Senate. Now the Senate begins their process which begins in the Senate Finance Committee.

Once the Senate reviews, debates and changes HB 1 in their committees and votes on the final bill it has changed drastically from the bill which the House approved. So they will now appoint a conference committee to work out the differences. The House and the Senate will each appoint 5 members to this conference committee who will have to reach a compromise and present a final version to their respective chambers. Our constitution requires a budget to be passed each session. If the House and Senate chambers cannot make an agreement before the session ends on June 1 this will then create the need for a Special Session which will last until the bill is passed. It will go then to the Governor's office who will be able to veto any provisions of the bill he finds objectionable, before signing the bill into law. At this point Texas will have an official budget for fiscal years 2016 and 2017.


