



### Concealed Carry Begins on Texas' University and College Campuses in 2016 & 2017

Campus shootings around the country in recent years have led conversations about how to stop, or at least make the probability much less likely, that these events will continue to happen. In Texas, it was made legal to carry a concealed handgun on campus in selected areas in 2013 by Senate Bill 1907, which has allowed licensed concealed handgun owners to have guns in locked cars in campus parking areas. More recently, Senate Bill 11 was signed into law by Governor Greg Abbott in June following the end of the 2015 Legislative Session. Senate Bill 11 was sponsored by Texas Representative Allen Fletcher of District 130 and allows carry of concealed guns, not open carry, in campus buildings unless the university has determined after reasonable consideration that an area should not allow the concealed guns. These areas or buildings should have signage posted stating that the concealed guns are not allowed. These restrictions are expected to be announced by the end of this calendar year. Texas is the most recent state to adopt laws to allow concealed carry weapons on college and university campuses in certain buildings. The seven other states which have provisions allowing the carrying of concealed weapons on campuses are Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Mississippi, Oregon, Utah and Wisconsin.

Of course there is opposition to this legislation and there have been reports that some of the most vocal protests have been coming from University of Texas Austin professors. Some are retiring and many others have signed petitions against having guns in classrooms. Some of their reasons include worry that there would be more possibilities for accidents and suicides or students would be fearful of engaging in the discussion of ideas concerning sensitive issues such as religion, politics or how the media influences public opinion, etc. They claim that if students in the classrooms are armed, there might not be any students willing to discuss these types of topics.

Senate Bill 11 will go into effect on August 1, 2016 for all state 4-year colleges and universities which will be 50 years to the day after the UT Tower shooting. On August 1, 1996, Charles Whitman fired his rifle for 96 minutes from the top of the University of Texas Clock Tower killing 16 and wounding 32. He was then gunned down by a police officer stopping the rampage. This was our nation's first mass campus shooting and this fact has been noted in several publications possibly fueling the protests particularly on the UT campus. Additionally, on August 1, 2017 SB 11 will go into effect for all state 2-year and junior colleges.

"The intent was that licensed concealed handgun license carriers be allowed to carry their concealed weapons into the classroom," said Allen Fletcher in an article in The Houston Chronicle on October 17, 2015. Fletcher, a Cypress Republican who is leaving the state House to run for constable in Harris County further stated, "We're not going to allow the regents or the students or professors to determine that you're not allowed to carry a weapon. The Legislature won't tolerate that."

Representative Fletcher, as quoted in the same Houston Chronicle article by Lauren McGaughy, said there are many misconceptions about campus carry. He said the law will have little impact because the community of student carriers would be relatively small, due to the age and background restrictions, as well as training requirements. He said statistics show low crime rates among gun license holders - just 0.3 percent of Texas licensees had criminal convictions in 2013 - and those who carry will be able to defend themselves and protect others if attacked.
