Greetings, Cy-Fair Republican Women

It is my pleasure to give a report on our State Convention in Dallas this past week. Members who attended were Joy Gregory, Mary Moss, Jan Ott, Rita Parrish, Beth Mayer, Edith Gibson, Barbara Buxton, Micheline Hutson, Sarah Singleton, and me. We had a very busy schedule from the moment we left Houston to the moment we pulled away from the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center on Saturday afternoon.

We listened to our government leaders give rousing speeches. Governor Greg Abbott spoke about how Texas leads the country with job opportunities and the importance of not giving-in to the National government trends to accept the "anything goes" attitudes of those who haven't decided on their gender. Lt. Governor Dan Patrick urged the school systems in Texas NOT to allow boys and girls to use the same restroom facilities and showers. (Of course, the very next day President Obama mandated all schools in the USA should allow gender choices in whatever capacity they choose.) We heard Ken Paxton speak about his journey to Austin and how each step seemed to fall in order and he is where he should be. We also were encouraged by Senator Ted Cruz' charge for unity. A Convention of States

A Convention of States - what is that? It's an idea being tossed around by the Texas Public Policy Foundation to amend the US Constitution. There is a process within the United States Constitution that allows a minimum of two-thirds of the states to conduct a convention to propose amendments to the United States Constitution, also called an Article V Convention, or Amendments Convention. By doing this they could then go around Congress and make amendments to our Constitution. Maybe this group of states could also override a federal law or Supreme Court ruling!

The present election cycle has brought about some different and interesting results thus far. It seems many of the citizens of the US are tired of business as usual and desire a change in our elected officials and how our business is done. Perhaps this would be the perfect year to try this Article V Convention because the people are ready for something new.

Six states have already joined this movement — Alabama, Alaska, Georgia, Florida, Indiana and Tennessee. There would need to be many more states to make this happen and since this has never happened before it might be hard to impossible to get this going. There are many changes needed on issues such as campaign finance reform, term limits and balanced budgets. If there aren't enough states to reach the "two-thirds supermajority" that a convention would require, it's believed that the effort to achieve it would inspire change!

Texas is also getting involved in the effort to make a convention of states happen. Governor Greg Abbott delivered the keynote address at the Texas Public Policy Foundation's Annual Policy Orientation in January 2016. He spoke about his Texas Plan to restore the Rule of Law and return the Constitution to its intended purpose. This is what Governor Abbott had to say as reported in the Governor's press release.

"The increasingly frequent departures from Constitutional principles are destroying the Rule of Law foundation on which this country was built," said Governor Abbott. "We are succumbing to the caprice of man that our Founders fought to escape. The cure to these problems will not come from Washington D.C. Instead, the states must lead the way. To do that I am adding another item to the agenda next session. I want legislation authorizing Texas to join other states in calling for a Convention of States to fix the cracks in our Constitution."

Even if the states that have started this movement don't reach their goal of two-thirds of the 50 states it might start them moving in the right direction and encourage the states to go forward and bring about the changes needed.
