To make sure you have access to all the direction you need, I'd like to offer the following information:

Early Voting: October 24-November 4, 2016

Voting Times and Locations:

During early voting you can vote at any early polling location. You will need to provide ID (not necessarily a photo ID), and the ballot that appears on your eSlate machine will be for your precinct. Please pay close attention to the schedule.

There is an expectation of high voter turnout this year, so you may want to consider early voting at your convenience. The closest location to me is the Bear Creek Community Center, but you can vote in any early voting location. The new community center on Greenhouse Road is spacious. There are also a couple of other new locations this year.

Election Day is November 8, 2016

Election Day is always the first Tuesday of November that follows the first Monday of November.

Times and Locations:<u>http://harrisvoterinfo.com/</u> **7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.** If you are in line by 7:00 P.M. but it takes time to get an eSlate machine available, you will still be allowed to vote. No one will be allowed to join the line after 7:00 P.M. A high voter turnout is expected at most of the precinct polling locations, so schedule your voting time wisely.

Re: Write-in vote. You certainly have the right to cast a Write-in vote...However, after all the work we've done to elect our Republican Candidate, it would perplex me as to why anyone would risk HRC getting an advantage by choosing to select a write-in candidate. In Texas, for a write-in vote to count, the candidate must have filed with enough signatures and followed all procedures. On our ballot, the only race in which any write-in candidates have qualified is for President. When you click on "write-in," the machine should come up with a way to allow you to spell out the name. Mike Sullivan Harris County Tax Assessor-Collector "The Atmosphere and State of the Upcoming Election in Harris County"



Harris County has set new voter registration records and continues to focus outreach efforts on educating voters. Mike Sullivan is responsible for insuring these records are accurate. He will provide updates from the tax office regarding these records and also issues related to property tax bills, tax rates and automobile registration, with respect to new changes with TxDMV. He will take questions from the audience, so come prepared!

Mike Sullivan is a native Houstonian, with a long history of community involvement. He was sworn in as Harris County Tax Assessor-Collector on January 1, 2013 and is currently serving a four-year term. He is focused on improving customer service, embracing technology, and advocating for the taxpayer. Sullivan was appointed by the Texas Water Development Board to serve on the Executive Committee of the Region H Water Planning Group. He then ran for the Humble ISD Board of Trustees.

Sullivan ran for Houston City Council in 2007, and was sworn into office in January 2008. Serving District E, he represented the communities of Kingwood and Clear Lake, as well as the Houston Ship Channel, Ellington Airport, and NASA/Johnson Space Center. He was elected to a third and final term, and he was the only member of the council to run unopposed in 2011.

Sullivan believes strongly in community involvement, as evidenced by his continued service in many community and business organizations. Sullivan presently serves as a board member of Hospital Corporation of America-Gulf Coast Division and Camp Allen. As well, he serves as Honorary Advisory Director for the 100 Club and as a Commissioner on the Texas Military Preparedness Commission. He is also a member of several area chambers of commerce.

Additionally, Sullivan is an Ex-Officio Director of the Bay Area Houston Economic Partnership and a member of the UH-Clear Lake Community Partners Council. Governor Rick Perry appointed Sullivan to serve on his nine-member Task Force on Unfunded Mandates. Mike and his wife Kim own and operate Mike Sullivan Realty, LLC. Their daughter Paige is a graduate of Baylor University. The Sullivan's attend Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Kingwood.

Sullivan received an Associate of Arts degree from Lone Star College-Kingwood in spring 2012. In 2014, at age 56, he graduated from UH-Downtown, with a Bachelor of Science in Political Science.

Legislative~ Rita Parrish

THE 85TH LEGISLATURE

The 85th Legislature will convene on January 10, 2017 but that doesn't mean members of our state government are sitting idle waiting until that time comes around. Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick has been busy working on issues that affect some of our citizens and setting up plans to put together emergency actions to help some of the vulnerable children of our state. These are children who are being neglected and or abused who need protection and also adoptive parents. Lt. Governor Dan Patrick has issued statements addressing these issues and is promising to put together a plan of action to get this process moving forward.

On October 12, 2016 the following statement was issued by Lt. Governor Dan Patrick: "The heartbreaking news from the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) that there is a substantial backlog in getting to children who are at risk of abuse or neglect is simply not acceptable. Today I joined with Governor Abbott and Speaker Straus in asking the Commissioner to act immediately to put together an emergency plan to eliminate the backlog."

"I have asked Chairman Nelson to convene the Finance Committee to receive the plan that will be submitted by DFPS and identify the best allocation and application of DFPS resources to protect one of our most vulnerable populations."

"I have also been working with DFPS for several months to activate a Faith-Based Collaboration that is engaging churches around the state to recruit potentially adoptive parents for the state's foster children. Over 560 partnerships with faith based leaders have signed on to participate so far. Lt. Governor Patrick will lead a Faith Based Community Summit about this effort on November 2."

And then on October 17, 2016 Lt. Governor Dan Patrick also issued this statement in conjunction with National Adoption Month in November: "Thousands of children in Texas' foster care system need your help. They need safe and loving homes, and many are looking for a forever home. Several elected state officials have opened their homes to children in need of loving families and are working with me to inspire a statewide movement to answer this calling. I hope you and your family will consider doing the same."

"I'm also appealing to Texas' faith-based community for help. I'm asking faith-based leaders across Texas to reach out to their congregations and communities to open their hearts and homes to the foster children of Texas."

"National Adoption Month was established to raise awareness of the need for many more foster and adoptive families and to recognize those who have already opened their hearts and homes to children in need."




CFRW 2016 CHRISTMAS PARTY INVITATION
