For our October meeting we welcome Rick Figueroa, a leader for the future of our Republican Party. The 2016 Elections are in full swing all around the country Early voting is so convenient because you can choose where and when you vote and the lines are always short and fast! The ballots are long and there are many candidates who need our votes.

US Candidates include Presidential, Vice Presidential Candidates and United State Representatives.

Texas State Candidates include Railroad Commissioner, Supreme Court Justices, Criminal Court of Appeals Judges, State Board of Education Members, State Senators and State Representatives.

Harris County Candidates include Justices for the Texas State Appeals Courts, District Judges, District Attorney, County Court Judges, County Attorney, Sheriff, Tax Assessor-Collector, County School Trustees, County Commissioners, Justices of the Peace, and Constables.

Every one of these offices is important and it can be tempting to just vote for the Presidential Candidates and stop there. The down ballot candidates all influence our everyday lives too. Court cases in particular are decided by Judges who have been elected and we need to learn all we can about these candidates and cast our vote for the ones who will make smart decisions and keep our state and county safe and prosperous. As members of Cy-Fair Republican Women we have access to candidates who come to our meetings or other clubs meetings. We can, if we wish, attend meetings and events all over the county, state and country in order to get to know these candidates who will be on the 2016 Ballot.

Or you can Click on the Poll Map Icon, enter your information and your specific ballot will open up and show all the candidates and propositions that you will be able to vote for in this election. These are very handy to print and share with friends and family who might want your advice in deciding for whom they should vote. These are fine to carry into the polls for your personal use while in the voting booth but not to share with others at the voting polls as this is against election policy.

Early Voting is the most efficient way to make sure you get your vote cast in this so important election in November 2016. Early Voting begins on October 24 and ends on November 4. These are the hours of Operation for the early voting period:

October 24-28: 8:00 am - 6:00 pm October 29: 7:00 am - 7:00 pm

October 30: 1:00 pm - 6:00 pm October 31-November 4: 7:00 am - 7:00 pm

Another advantage in voting early is that would then allow you to help at a voting location on Election Day, November 8, 2016. We have several Precinct Chairs who are members of Cy-Fair Republican Women who always need workers to help at her poll. Our Precinct Chairs will need workers on Election Day to fill positions like poll watching and election judges and to act as clerks. There is some training involved so contact your Precinct Chair to find out what kind of help is needed. You can find your Precinct Number on your Voter's Registration Card. Go to the Harris County GOP website. There you will click on Our Party, click on Precinct Lookup, there enter your Precinct Number or your address and your Chair's name and contact information will be displayed. Let your Precinct Chair know that you would like to help and your Chair will get back with you. You may also help other Precinct Chairs with their polling location if yours has enough workers already.

President **Millie Alford** called the meeting to order at 11:00 A.M. and welcomed all attendees. Chaplain **Fae Lord** led us in American moments, prayer and pledges to American and Texas flags.

1stVP Jan Ott introduced our guest speaker, Mr. Kevin Roberts, Candidate for Texas Representative, District 126. His message emphasized our need for strong leadership, a common sense approach to solving problems, a balanced budget. He will support an exemption from the 4% budget reduction for CPS, Education, Mental Health, and Border Security. He supports a faith based-Safe Families Program and conservative values. There are block walks every Saturday, phone calling everyday. Our goal is to defeat Clinton. Please go vote. Thanks to Mr. Roberts for spending time with us today. Summary of August Social and Minutes were published in the Newsletter.

Micheline Hutson, Treasurer, reports a balance of \$25,351.53, after deposits of \$1,639.00 and disbursements of \$2,986.17. The CFRW Scholarship Fund has a balance of \$6,536.41.

Nominations were taken for the Nominating Committee and the following members were selected: **Edith Gibson, Barbara Buxton, Rita Parrish, Kristin Govantes, and Clarisa Fether**. This committee will prepare a slate of officers for the next term 2017-2018 to be presented at the November General Meeting, according to the CFRW By-Laws, Article VII, Sections 1 & 2. New officers will be installed at the December Meeting.

Alice Bennett reported that voter ID may include a utility bill and/or a checkbook. On October 6, the Reach Unlimited Benefit Luncheon will be at the Berry Center, 12-1. Please direct questions to **Alice.**


