

#### Draining the Swamp ... Texas Style

In an era when the public is suspicious of anyone in public office, Governor Abbott identified, early on, ethics reform as one of his key emergency initiatives for this session of the Texas Legislature. This comes after the disappointing failure in the previous Legislative Session to pass such a bill when several amendments were added in the House which were viewed to be unconstitutional measures and largely contributing to its non-passage.

From these lessons learned, the 2017 Senate sponsors and supporters for ethics reform are attempting to maintain focus and momentum with their efforts, and have met with interim success:

SB 14, this session's ethics reform bill was unanimously approved by the Texas Senate on February 7, 2017 and is now in the Texas House of Representatives. It was the first bill passed by the Senate during the current session. Essentially, the proposed law in its current form would accomplish several things:

- Legislators and other statewide elected officials would be removed from office should they be convicted of a felony, and
  those convicted of abuse of office be barred from receiving publicly funded pension checks while serving a sentence for
  such a crime.
- Legislators would be required to disclose government contracts that they or their families have with government entities, and, in addition, legislators providing bond counsel services or receiving legal referral fees would also need to disclose those arrangements.
- Lobbyists would have to report more of what they spend on members of the legislative and executive branches of Texas government and their immediate family members. Specifically, lobbyists would need to report any spending that exceeds 30% of the current legislative per diem of \$190. (Right now, they only report if what they spend exceeds 60% of that amount.)
- Legislators would be required to wait a specified period, currently anchored on the two-year legislative cycle, before registering or working as a lobbyist; in addition, the bill establishes criminal offenses for noncompliance with certain of the bill's requirements.

Governor Abbott acknowledged the passage of SB14 in the Senate by commenting that "The faith that people have in their democracy is linked to the trust they have in their elected officials. Representatives in Austin must be voting with their constituents' interests in mind – not their own."

Will the legislation be successful this time around and ethics reform enacted? Continue to follow the progress of SB14 and find out your own State Representative's position concerning the bill as we watch Austin's efforts at swamp-draining.
