STATEWIDE ELECTION TO AMEND THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION

The Texas Legislature can only do so much. Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Texas require not only that a super-majority of the Legislature approve any such amendment, but that Texas voters also approve the measure. Seven amendments are proposed in the upcoming November 7 election for which early voting has already begun.

The following "Guide" is from the Harris County Republican Party website. It provides a comprehensive summary of all proposed amendments together with the Texas Secretary of State's explanatory statement.

All members of Cy-Fair Republican Women are encouraged to study the amendments, vote, and encourage friends and family to do likewise.

<u>Guide to the November 7th Constitutional Amendment Election</u> (from the Harris County GOP website)

In 2017, the 85th Texas Legislature passed seven joint resolutions proposing amendments to the state constitution, and these proposed amendments will be offered for approval by the voters of Texas on the November 7, 2017, election ballot.

The Texas Constitution provides that the legislature, by a two-thirds vote of all members of each house, may propose amendments revising the constitution and that proposed amendments must then be submitted for approval to the qualified voters of the state. A proposed amendment becomes a part of the constitution if a majority of the votes cast in an election on the proposition are cast in its favor. Now it is up to you.

The 2017 Texas Constitutional Amendment Election is Tuesday, November 7th.

For more information, read the <u>Analyses of Proposed Constitutional Amendments, Nov. 7, 2017, Election</u> published by the Texas Legislative Council.

(Note the ballot in the City of Houston contains several measures including proposals for the passage of certain spending bonds, the sale of mixed drinks in The Heights and HISD trustees for which voters outside of the City do not vote. In the Cy-Fair area, voters are being asked to elect CFISD Trustees for positions 5, 6 and 7, of which only one position is being challenged.)

PROPOSITION 1 (HJR 21) Texas House Vote: 143 Yeas, 0 Nays, 3 Present, not voting "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization for less than the market value of the residence homestead and harmonizing certain related provisions of the Texas Constitution."

Explanatory Statement:

HJR 21 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the Texas legislature to expand the circumstances under which a partially disabled veteran or their spouse may qualify for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the veteran's residence homestead. Currently, the Texas legislature may provide that a partially disabled veteran or their spouse is entitled to an exemption from ad valorem taxation of a percentage of the market value of the disabled veteran's residence homestead only if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization at no cost to the veteran. The amendment would allow the Texas legislature to provide that the exemption also may be taken when the residence homestead was donated, sold, or transferred to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization for less than the market value of the residence homestead. The amendment also harmonizes certain related provisions of the Texas Constitution.

PROPOSITION 2 (SJR 60) Texas House Vote: 143 Yeas, 0 Nays, 2 Present, not voting "The constitutional amendment to establish a lower amount for expenses that can be charged to a borrower and removing certain financing expense limitations for a home equity loan, establishing certain authorized lenders to make a home equity loan, changing certain options for the refinancing of home equity loans, changing the threshold for an advance of a home equity line of credit, and allowing home equity loans on agricultural homesteads."

Explanatory Statement: SJR 6 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the	Texas legislature to require any court that is hearing a challenge to the constitutionality of a state statute to notify the attorney gen- eral of that challenge, if the party raising the challenge notifies the court that the party is challenging the constitutionality of such stat-	ute. Additionally, the amendment would allow the Texas legislature to set a period of not more than 45 days following the notification to the attorney general that the court must wait before rendering a judg- ment that a state statute is uncon- stitutional.
PROPOSITION 5 (HJR 100) Texas House Vote: 110 Yeas, 12 Nays, 2 Present, not voting "The constitutional amend- ment on professional sports team charitable foundations	conducting charitable raffles." Explanatory Statement: HJR 100 proposes a constitutional amendment to provide a more	detailed definition of "professional sports team" for purposes of their charitable foundations, which the Texas legislature may permit to hold charitable raffles. The amend- ment also deletes a requirement	that an eligible professional sports team charitable foundation per- mitted by the Texas legislature to hold charitable raffles had to be in existence on January 1, 2016.
PROPOSITION 6 (SJR 1) Texas House Vote: 147 Yeas, 0 Nays, 2 Present, not voting "The constitutional amend- ment authorizing the legisla- ture to provide for an exemp- tion from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market val- ue of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a first responder who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty."	Explanatory Statement: SJR 1 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the Texas legislature by general law to provide that a surviving spouse of a first responder who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty is entitled to receive an exemption from ad valorem taxation from all or part of the market value on the surviving spouse's residence homestead, as long as the surviv-	ing spouse has not remarried since the death of the first responder. It would also allow the Texas legisla- ture to provide that the surviving spouse, who qualifies and receives the exemption and then qualifies a different property as the surviving spouse's residence homestead, receive an exemption from ad valorem taxation of the different homestead in an amount equal to the dollar amount of the exemp- tion of the first homestead for	which the exemption was received in the last year in which the surviv- ing spouse received the exemption for that first homestead. Like the initial exemption, this benefit wil only remain available if the surviv- ing spouse has not remarried since the death of the first responder The proposed amendment would apply only to ad valorem taxes imposed for a tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2018.

HJR 37 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the Texas legislature to make an exception to the law regarding the award of certain prizes. Currently,

programs where the award of gifts is based on luck or chance. The proposed amendment would make an exception to this general rule to allow the Texas legislature to aucourage savings, would award prizes based on luck or chance to the credit union's or financial institution's customers.


