Be cautious of "pay to play" endorsement mailers! tend local candidate forums so that you hear answers to the questions asked. Go to the candidates' websites and read their resumes and how they stand on issues. Attend Cy-Fair Republican Women Meetings and talk to politically active people about their knowledge of each candidate. Check the candidate's voting record if they have one! After you make an informed decision, share with your family, friends and neighbors and then take yourself and a few others to the polls on March 6. You can also vote early at numerous locations or by mail if you qualify. Go www.harrisvotes.com to get details.

There will be a Precinct Convention on March 6 at each polling location immediately after the polls close. In order to attend your Senatorial District Convention on March 24, you need to attend this Precinct Convention and get on the delegate list. At the Senatorial District Convention (these are held in various area locations which are determined by the Senate District you vote in), the delegates to the Texas Republican Party Convention will be chosen. The 2018 RPT Convention will be in San Antonio in June.

Join us at the next meeting to hear the latest inside scoop about what is happening in the United States Senate.

Our speaker in February will be Jay Guerrero, the Regional Director for Texas' Senior Senator and Majority Whip, Senator John Cornyn.

Jay Guerrero is an important part of the Senator's team that is working for Texans. He established the Southeast Texas office which manages a region of 24 counties along the Texas Gulf coast and stretches from Beaumont to Victoria and east of College Station to Galveston. The region encompasses over seven million of the senator's constituents including the large urban areas of Houston, Galveston, Beaumont and Victoria and important entities such as the Texas Medical Center, the Port of Houston and the Johnson Space Center as well as one of the world's largest concentrations of refineries.

Prior to his position with Senator Cornyn, Jay worked at the James A. Baker III Institute for Public Policy at Rice University where he managed programs surrounding world leaders such as Secretary James A. Baker III, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Nelson Mandela, and the King and Queen of Jordan, to name a few. He also has worked with City of Houston Councilman Orlando Sanchez, the Chancellor of the University of Houston System and in the Texas House of Representatives and Texas Senate.

Jay will be updating you on what the Senator is doing to represent you in the U. S. Senate. Please join us for this informative presentation.

(During 2018, when the Texas Legislature is not in session, we hope to focus on some of the legislation being considered by the United States Congress which may be of interest to our CFRW members.)

Final Amendment to Tax Reform Law Benefits Children's Education

By way of background, "529 Plans" refer to the portion of the U.S. Tax Code which provides for establishment the "qualified tuition programs" which permit families to invest money in accounts which can grow tax-free for school tuition and other educational ex-For example, penses. Texas offers two 529 plan programs: The Texas Tuition Promise Fund and the Texas College Savings Plan.

Up until the new Tax Cuts and Jobs Act passed, these

tax incentives were limited to college-level edu-In December cation. 2017, an amendment was filed to the Senate's version of the tax reform bill which provides for the expansion of 529 plans to also cover public, private and religious K-12 elementary and secondary school programs. The amendment was passed and ultimately incorporated into the new law. (It should be noted that the amendment originally sought to also cover homeschool students but

was not successful in this regard.) The measure was observed as "helping working class and middle-income families save and prepare for their children's educational expenses."

Up to \$10,000 per year of savings from qualified plans may be spent for children in the K-12 grade categories. The section of The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act addressing 529 Qualified Tuition Programs follows this article. Any adjustments to the existing Texas 529 plan programs to take into account the

new law have not yet occurred and should be monitored.

As many of us continue to work on our personal and family goals for 2018 and beyond – and the budgeting to make them happen the expanded 529 plan programs give us the added advantage of a new tool and resource.

Excerpt from The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act:

SEC. 11032. 529 ACCOUNT FUNDING FOR ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION.

- (a) IN GENERAL.
 - (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 529(c) is amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:
- "(7) TREATMENT OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY TUITION. —Any reference in this subsection to the term 'qualified higher education expense' shall include a reference to expenses for tuition in connection with enrollment or attendance at an elementary or secondary public, private, or religious school.".
 - (2) LIMITATION.—Section 529(e)(3)(A) is amended by adding at the end the following: "The amount of cash distributions from all qualified tuition programs described in subsection (b)(1)(A)(ii) with respect to a beneficiary during any taxable year shall, in the aggregate, include not more than \$10,000 in expenses described in subsection (c)(7) incurred during the taxable year.".
- (b) EFFECTIVE DATE. —The amendments made by this section shall apply to distributions made after December 31, 2017.
